Dear Sirs,

Following a number of requests from several airline representatives in Curaçao about the policy for crew layover in Curaçao, we would like to inform you as follows.

The directive issued by the Curaçao Civil Aviation Authority, dated 29 June 2020 (CURCW/20/138-8) with regard to the Closure of Airport Hato in Curaçao for inbound passengers from all countries is effective as of July 1 and will remain in force until further notice.

With regard to airline crews, paragraph 5 of the above-mentioned directive applies. For the layover of crews in Curaçao, the following guidelines are applicable and in accordance with ICAO CART, Council Aviation Recovery Task Force, working group guidelines.

Neither a COVID-19 PCR test nor a Public Health Passenger Locator Card (PLC) is required for airline crews, however face masks shall be used at all times from the moment of disembarking the aircraft, transfer by bus to the crew hotel.

Aircraft crews must wear face masks during the length of their stay in and around the hotel if social distancing cannot be maintained. This means that they can enter the permitted area of the hotel while taking into account social distancing or wearing a mask if this is not possible. Crew members are not allowed to freely move around outside the hotel area while staying in Curaçao.

These guidelines are applicable for crews operating from the countries listed in the attached "Risk Classification Countries and Territories COVID-19 as of June 29, 2020" as amended.

We hope this clarifies the required behavior of crews during layover in Curaçao.
